WHAT TO DO IF A FLOOD WARNING HAS BEEN ISSUED

ACT EARLY - don't ignore the warnings

Move your car to a safe place

Pack a bag ready to evacuate

Put your flood defences in place

Put in place airbrick covers

Block sinks, toilets, washing machines, dishwashers etc

Move valuables and electrical items to the first floor

Move or raise furniture

Prioritise stock that needs to be moved

Pack a list of important contacts

Take photos to create a timeline of events

Follow advice from the EA, Emergency Services and the Emergency Volunteers

If time and safe to do so help your vulnerable neighbours

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

Insurance

- Make sure your insurance is up to date and the information and contact details are in a safe place.
- Ensure the insurance covers you for flood damage

Flood prevention

- Flood prevention products can be useful, especially in smaller events.
 Consider lockable airbrick covers and floodgates for external doors.
- Waterproof tape to seal windows and large waterproof bags which furniture can be lifted into can be helpful

Blocked drains

- Report blocked drains to CCC Highways On 0300 303 2992
- Out of hours call 999 if there is an imminent threat of flooding

What CERG will do:

- Offer help where we can to move things if enough volunteers available

The following is a simple checklist that can be followed during an emergency to ensure that you don't forget important things. Some of these can be undertaken beforehand, whereas for others you will need to wait until an emergency warning has been issued in your area. Even if you can't manage all of these, by doing what you can, you will be better prepared for an emergency affecting your home or business.

Things to think about

- · Where to move your car?
- · Where will you go?
- · How/ where will you meet with your employees
- Do you know who is working on the day and who is not?
- · Know your local flood warning area
- Know how to turn off gas, electricity and water
- Important computer information backed up onto a USB stick or the Cloud
- Check smoke / carbon dioxide alarms weekly
- Store important items upstairs or on upper shelves (bank statements / photo albums)

What to take, have ready

- Important documents (e.g., insurance documents)
- > First aid kit and whistle to signal for help
- Notebook & pen / pencil with key contact details
- Spare glasses/contact lenses, keys
- Mobile and charger
- iPad / laptop /chargers
- Wallet/purse
